EXAMPLES OF IHE TRAINING COURSES



Highway Law Principles and Practice

This course is intended to deliver a broad understanding of the law on Highways (in theory and practice) principally for highway engineers but also for anyone requiring additional knowledge of this area of law.



Introduction to ITS (Online)

This 2 day course aims to provide an introduction to ITS outlining an understanding of the principles of the use of ITS and also provide confidence on the principles and practices of it's deployment.



Traffic Signal Control From Design to Implementation

This course is for managers, engineers and technicians involved in the management, design or implementation of traffic control systems.

It underpins the systems and processes that ensure the current and future safeguarding of the highways industry.


